Potential Projects to Consider:

- Elementary School No 25
 - 89,000 sf new elementary school to address the growth identified in the demographic report.
- Middle School No. 9
 - 185,000 sf new middle school to address the growth identified in the demographic report.
- Elementary School No 26
 - 89,000 sf new elementary school to address the growth identified in the demographic report.
- Transportation Facility – East
 - New Transportation facility in eastern side of District
 - 17,000 s.f. transportation building
 - 6 maintenance bays
 - Offices, Dispatch, Driver Holding
 - Wash Bay
 - Fueling Stations
 - Parking for 100 buses and 135 vehicles
- Transportation Facility – West
 - Build New Main Transportation Building to replace existing undersized office and (3) portable buildings.
 - 21,500 s.f. transportation office building
 - Office space for 16 employees
 - Dispatch, Driver Holding
 - Training rooms for District-Wide staff meetings, training, and testing
- Technology Building
 - Capital Improvements
 - (Considerations)
 - Architectural
 - Repair and Paint exterior plaster veneer
 - Replace sealants at opening and control joints
 - Provide new flooring within the building

- (District Priorities)
 - ADA/Civil
 - Replace non-compliant curb ramps, replace approximately 750 s.f. of damaged paving and sidewalks.
 - MEP
 - Replace 11 rooftop units due to end of life cycle.
 - Replace fire alarm due to end of life cycle.
 - Provide dry chemical fire suppression system for data center NOC.

- Norman T. Sisk annex Complex
 - Capital Improvements
 - (Considerations)
 - MEP
 - Add conditioned air to warehouse – Add 9 new units
 - (District Priorities)
 - ADA/Civil
 - Replace non-compliant curb ramps, replace approximately 4,980 s.f. of damaged paving, 317 s.f. of damaged sidewalk, regrade and modify drainage system to address low area near the building
 - MEP
 - Replace 13 rooftop units due to end of life cycle.
 - Replace fire alarm due to end of life cycle.

- Central Services Building
 - Capital Improvements
 - (Considerations)
 - Architectural
 - Replace all sealants in exterior of building due to age
 - Complete renovation of (2) public restrooms
 - Renovation to (3) staff restrooms.
 - Replace aged and damaged casework
 - (District Priorities)
 - ADA/Civil
 - Replace non-compliant door hardware and address level changes in sidewalks, replace approximately 1,786 s.f. of damaged paving, 175 s.f. of damaged sidewalk.
 - MEP
 - Replace 1 rooftop units due to end of life cycle.
 - Replace electrical gear due to age and condition.
 - Replace fire alarm due to end of life cycle
 - Address clearance issues at main switchboard

- Addition to Braswell High School
 - Addition onto Braswell High School to address growth identified in the demographic report.

- Stadium at Braswell High School
 - Build new stadium at Braswell High School to assist in scheduling of existing stadiums usage.
